- Leave a message on the Attendance Office answering machine 24 hours a day

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## Clubs

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OHS offers many diverse activities. Membership in clubs and activities is open to all students. However, students who hold leadership positions in recognized ASB clubs must purchase an ASB card validation sticker.

**Art Club** - Students in art club help one another learn about artistic style. Student work is displayed throughout the school. Students may enter regional and state competitions and one piece of student work is added to the Central Kitsap School District art collection each spring.

**ASB (Associated Student Body)** - Every student at OHS is a member of the ASB. Student funds are raised through the sale of ASB cards. Students with ASB privileges are admitted to athletic home games for free and receive a reduced price at away games. Students with ASB card privileges also get a discount on various school activities. All students participating in co-curricular activities are required to purchase an ASB card.

**ASB Executive Board** - The Executive Board has authority over student affairs as per state law, the responsibilities defined in the constitution, and duties assigned by members of the student body. The officers of this organization shall be President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, Sergeant-at-Arms, and Historian. Elections will be held every spring.

**ASL (American Sign Language)** - ASL club is a place where students will practice what they have learned in class and extend their knowledge about the deaf/hearing impaired culture and environment. Students do not need to be enrolled in an ASL class to be a member of this club.

**Asian Pacific Islander Club** - The Asian Pacific Islander Club (API for short) exists to bring our school community together. This is a place where students can share their cultural teachings and enjoy each other's company. The club is open to all OHS students.

**Band/Orchestra** - Olympic High School's bands/orchestra are offered as separate classes and make up part of the Olympic music department. In addition to school concerts, band/orchestra members compete in league and state solo/ensemble contests as well as in marching band competitions.

**Book Club** - The OHS Book Club selects at least one book per quarter to read and discuss. The club has focused on fantasy, dystopian fiction, and occasionally even non-fiction, as well as screening movie versions of their favorite literature selections. If you enjoy reading and would like to share your love of books with like-minded students, Book Club welcomes you.

**Cheerleading** - Cheer at OHS is co-ed. The squad cheers at football and boys and girls basketball games. The squad also competes in regional cheer competitions. Tryouts are held in the spring.

**Choir** - Olympic High School's choral program consists of three different choirs that offer students a wide variety of musical experiences and performance opportunities. Music styles including jazz, Broadway, contemporary and traditional choral music are studied throughout the year. Performances include league contests, various school and community events, and numerous festivals throughout the Pacific Northwest and beyond! Music Theory and AP Music Theory are also offered to those students that wish to further their pursuit of music.

**Class Councils** - There are four (4) class councils, each one representing seniors, juniors, sophomores, and freshmen. Each class council will represent and organize activities for their class. Each class will elect a President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, and Historian to

serve for a one (1) year. Elections for senior, junior, and sophomore classes will be held in the spring and freshmen class in the fall.

**Cooking and Community Club** - (formerly known as FCCLA) is a career and technical student organization for young men and women in Family and Consumer Sciences. Projects could focus on a variety of youth concerns, do volunteer work through food and hygiene drives and have a Valentine sale. Additionally, we will have a monthly cooking lab day to expand our culinary skills. Involvement in Cooking and Community Club offers members the opportunity to practice their leadership potential and develop skills for life necessary in the home and workplace.

**Debate** - Debate is an activity which provides real world skills for leadership and success. These skills include:

- Thinking on your feet
- Awareness of world affairs
- Rhetorical skills for communicating your ideas effectively
- Research and organization skills
- Learning effective argumentation and evaluating the validity of evidence
- Gaining confidence in your ideas

Debate Club works in conjunction with Speech and Debate Class and the Debate Team to provide students the opportunity to compete in regional tournaments. The club is open to all students grades 9-12, and will focus on improving debating skills in order to be more competitive in tournaments. In addition, the club may participate in some fundraising to aid in tournament costs, and will communicate with parents and other community members to help to coordinate volunteers to serve as judges at the tournaments.

**DECA (Distributive Education Clubs of America)** - DECA is a national student leadership organization. It's an association of marketing students. The goals of this group include leadership development, vocational understanding, social development, and civic consciousness. Students participate in leadership conferences and marketing competitions each year. Student enrolled in Store Operations and Store Management are encouraged to join.

**Drama** – The Olympic Drama Club offers students the opportunity to demonstrate their active enjoyment of theater. Some of the areas they may participate include: acting, lighting, stage design, make-up, publicity, and volunteering in local community theaters. Without the Forum to perform in this year, the Drama Club will seek out unique performance opportunities and venues.

**FBLA (Future Business Leaders of America)** - This is a national and vocational organization made up of students interested in pursuing careers in business or office occupations. Goals of this group include scholarship, leadership, character development, establishment of occupational goals, and the transition from school to work. Students enrolled in business education classes are encouraged to join FBLA.

**Garden Club** - The garden club promotes unity and team collaboration in a relaxing environment of gardening with peers. The club has many activities throughout the year. These include: growing exotic plants, hydroponics, raising plants from seeds and starts, annual plant sales in the fall and spring and field trips to further our general gardening knowledge. This club promotes a community setting for working together and provides knowledge for students intending to move into a career of agriculture, landscaping, or floral arrangement.

**Gay-Straight Alliance** – This club is a safe place for students to meet, support each other, talk about issues related to sexual orientation and gender identity and expression, and work to end homophobia and transphobia. The GSA at OHS strives to support students who are struggling with their identities as gay, lesbian, bisexual, transgender, or questioning, to build a community for LGBTQ students and their straight allies, and to take action to improve the school climate with regards to sexual orientation and gender identity.

**Hip Hop Club** - The Hip Hop Club was established to promote unity and collaboration with an energetic environment, and to give students an opportunity for fun exercise and self-expression through dance.

**Honor Society - Honor Society** - All students with a GPA of 3.5 and above are encouraged to join the Olympic High School Chapter of National Honor Society. Individuals who meet the GPA requirement and demonstrate characteristics of leadership, character and community service are eligible to be inducted as members once they reach sophomore status.

**House of Representatives** – House of Representatives is made up of elected student leaders and representatives from all WICOR classes. Students on the council are expected to represent the members of their WICOR class as well as communicate to them the topics and decisions of the meetings of the House of Representatives. Council members are responsible for writing the ASB budget, approving grants/loans of ASB money, and approving any amendments to the Associated Student Body Constitution.

**Japanese Club** - This club explores the Japanese culture.

**Key Club** - Key Club is the oldest and largest community service program for high school students. Our Key Club is a student-led organization that provides its members with opportunities to perform service (to both school and community), build character and develop leadership. **Motto:** Caring—Our way of life.

**Knowledge Bowl** - Members represent OHS in competitions of general knowledge in the areas of history, geography, English, math, the arts, and science. Members participate in district, regional, and state competitions.

**Link Crew** – Link Crew is a high school transition program that increases freshman success. Members of the junior and senior class are trained to be Link Leaders. These Link Leaders act as positive role models, motivators, and mentors helping guide the freshmen to discover what it takes to be successful during the transition to high school.

**Math Club** - The Olympic Math Team competes against other Washington high schools in a series of competitions. Students in all mathematics classes taught at OHS are encouraged to participate. The final team is chosen on the basis of performance on practice tests. Members participate in district, regional, and state competitions.

**Robotics** – Olympic High School part of the district wide FIRST Robotics (FRC) team, Team 3223, Robotics of Central Kitsap. The varsity Sport for the Mind™, FRC combines the excitement of sport with the rigors of science and technology. Under strict rules, limited resources, and time limits, teams of 25 students or more are challenged to raise funds, design a team "brand," hone teamwork skills, and build and program robots to perform prescribed tasks against a field of competitors. It's as close to "real-world engineering" as a student can get. Volunteer professional mentors lend their time and talents to guide each team.

**Sailing Club** - Do you know how to sail, or want to learn how to sail? Then this is the club for you. The club takes all students, regardless of sailing experience, and teaches them proper sailing techniques and safety. Club members may enter competitions. Competitive racing starts in mid-February for those interested. Casual weekly outings begin in early to mid- May. Check web site for specific dates. **Sci-Fi Club** - The purpose of this organization is to give students with common interest in Science Fiction a chance to connect, enjoy, and discuss their ideas and beliefs in the world of whatever fandom(s) they belong.

**Skills USA** - Skills USA is a national organization which allows students to experience and learn leadership skills in various trade and industrial programs. Skills USA students participate in leadership conferences, contests, and skill competitions. Skills USA promotes leadership development, civic consciousness, and career skills.

**Writing Club** - This club supports students interested in the writing process, creative writing and expression through words.

**Yearbook** - Yearbooks are designed and produced by OHS students under the direction of a faculty teacher/advisor. This class gives students the opportunity to experience the publishing business. Students are responsible for photography, copy writing, and layout of the yearbook. The books are sold during the August registration time and the first month of school at pre-payment discounted prices. After that time, prices increase and yearbooks may only be purchased before winter break and after spring break as long as supplies last.
