This is time to practice the newly learned skills and ask questions. Students are expected to be on task and working on math.

- Know that it is o.k. to make mistakes.
- Do not make others uncomfortable by your behavior.

### Mathematics Department Shared Expectations for 2017-2018

- > Cell phones in the classroom will be used for Algebra 2 academic use only.
- > There is no food or drinks in my classroom with the exception of water with a cap.
- Using electronic devices to access calculator games, cell phone games, texting, social media, etc. is not allowed.
- > The wearing of hoods, sunglasses or any such item that covers a student's is not acceptable in class.
- > Cards, dice, and other games are not allowed unless part of a class activity.
- > Students are responsible for getting their work in on time when they miss class.

**Calculators:** Students are required to have a Texas Instruments graphing calculator (TI-83+, or TI-84 series) for use in the classroom and doing homework. It is not necessary to get a "silver" edition or color, however you may if you wish. I know these can be expensive, usually around \$60-120, however, they are a good investment for future math/business/science classes and college. If you absolutely cannot afford one, please let me know as soon as possible. We have a very limited supply that can be checked out from the library if necessary. It is NOT recommended that you buy a Casio or the TI-85, TI-86, or TI-89.

Calculators are merely tools for people. They are not "smart", they will not think for you, but they will make YOUR thinking and decision making easier, more efficient, and more accurate. You must understand that you are expected to:

- Know when it is appropriate to use a calculator and when it is not.
- Show the work for all your mathematics problems, not just answers.
- Be able to explain HOW you got an answer to a problem, not just what buttons you pushed.

Late Homework: Homework is accepted late and is marked 20% off each day late.

I am often here after school and can be here before or after school if arrangements are made. Other math teachers are also willing to answer questions if they are here working after school. You are also expected to utilize the Tutorial opportunities at school. We also have tutoring in room D-4 after school. Don't be afraid to ask!

#### Tardy/Absence Policy: Will follow the school policy

- 1<sup>st</sup> Unexcused tardy = Warning
- 2<sup>nd</sup> Unexcused tardy = Detention with Mr. Nelson for 30 minutes and a call home.
- 3<sup>rd</sup> Unexcused tardy = 1 hour of Work Study and a call home.
- 4<sup>th</sup> Unexcused tardy = Administrative Referral

If you are more than 10 minutes late for class it is an Unexcused Absence (Truancy).

#### Test/Quiz policy:

There will be one test per unit and at least one quiz per unit. These tests and quizzes are to be taken individually. There will be no retakes for tests and quizzes.

#### Absences:

It is very important for students to attend class as much as possible. Much of the class work and class discussions cannot be made up, however, when absent students are responsible for getting missed assignments and reviewing the material on their own. Students may make an appointment to meet with me before or after school to catch up if necessary.
