You are registering for an Advanced Placement® (AP) course at OHS for the following school year. AP courses are college-level courses offered in high school. It involves making the commitment to meet the expectations below.
Student/Parent expectations:
• AP & Pre-AP courses demand more of students than regular or Honors courses; they are more fast-paced and cover more material than typical high school classes.
 More time, inside and outside of the classroom, is required to complete lessons, assignments, and homework-approximately 1 hour of work per night/per AP class.
• AP & Pre-AP courses are year-long commitments. Due to master scheduling conflicts, students will not be allowed to withdraw from the final roster once schedules are created.
 Students and Parent/Guardians: Should concerns arise and/or students struggle in class, they will take the necessary steps to seek out the teacher and/or school resources for support.
• At the end of each AP course students take and pay for the AP Exam , the standardized exam that measures how well students have mastered college-level course work. There is financial assistance for qualifying families.
Benefits of AP
• Research shows that students who take AP courses and exams are much more likely than their peers to complete a college degree on time-in four years.
• Students have the opportunity to earn college credit by meeting the standard on the culminating AP Exam in May.
